Since the 1st of November 2022 when all partners started working on the See Me, Hear Me project we have managed to deliver the Evaluation Toolkit for refugee and migrant representation in the media that includes a set of criteria to judge regions' representation of migrants in media.

COFAC as the leading organisation on this output is currently reviewing all the stories in order to form the See Me, Hear Me case studies and develop the related booklet.

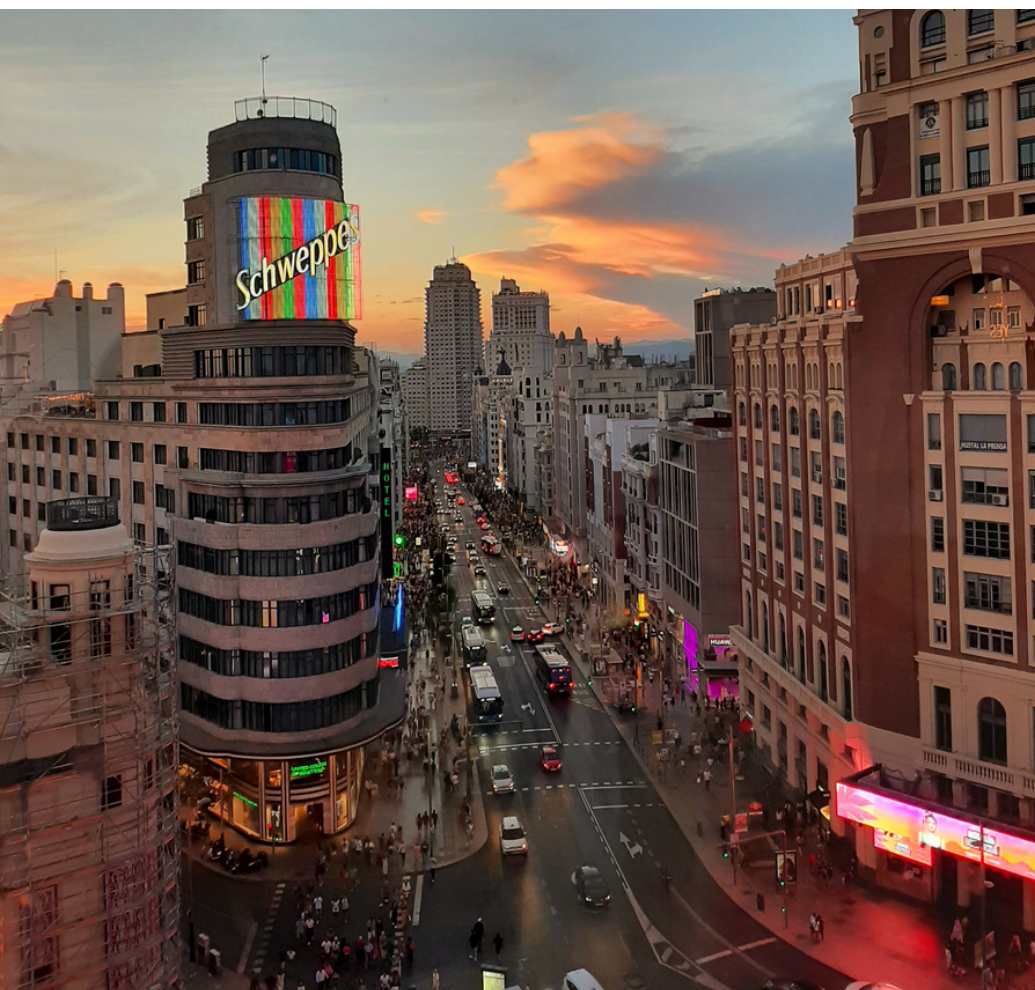
